St.Joseph's College of Education for Women, Guntur, organized a National Seminar on "Promotion of Ethics and Human Values" for 2 days on 29th & 30th September 2016 with the financial support of UGC, New Delhi.

The seminar began on 29th September 2016 with invocation & lightening the lamp by the delegates. Dr.C.Grace Indira, welcomed the guests, delegates & resource persons

on to the dais and the Principal Dr.T.Swarupa Rani, presented the welcome address. The correspondent, Rev.Dr.Sr.G.Theresamma, presided the inaugural function. The organizing secretary Smt.B.M.Sucharitha, presented the theme of the seminar. Prof.K.R.S.Sambasiva Rao, Rector, A.N.U, inaugurated the seminar and delivered inaugural address. The seminar began on 23rd March 2017 with invocation & lighting the lamp by the delegates. Dr.C.Grace Indira welcomed the guests, delegates & resource persons. The principal Dr.T.Swarupa Rani, presented the welcome address. The correspondent Dr.Sr.G.Theresamma presided the inaugural function. The organising secretary Smt.P.Regeena Madhuri presented the theme of the seminar.

Mrs.T.Sobha Manjari, Addl. S.P, Vigilance Dept., Guntur, Inaugurated the seminar & delivered inaugural address. In her address she expressed that a strong family is responsible for developing ethics & values and try to radiate the gender discrimination. Every woman should be aware of their rights and develop self confidence.

Prof. B.Ratna Kumari, Director, Dr.Durga Bai Deshmukh Centre for Women’s Studies, Andhra University, delivered the keynote address. In this address, she clearly mentioned about the root causes for violence against women, steps to end the violence. She strongly opined that woman is not a weakling, but very strong because women are

On the second day i.e. today the technical session started at 09.30 A.M. with plenary lecture by Dr.V.Rajeswari, Head, Dept. of Education & Dean, Mother Theresa Women's University, Kodaikanal, Tamilnadu. She gave a lead lecture on the topic "Preventing Violence against women – it's in our hand let's empower". Madam started that the international tourists are afraid of India, due to the higher rate of violence against women & the tourists are decreasing day by day. Women should be aware of all the acts & rights of women & make use of them for the liberation, safeguarding & empowering women's.

- Educate women for empowerment.

- Almost all the student teachers are happy with the time they spent in the institution and found it enriching. They are completely satisfied with the examination system, project work, practical work, the existing internal assessment and with the good communicative

abilities of the faculty. The analysis of the exit questionnaires filled in by the students helps in introspection and results in quality enhancement. A brief summary of the findings are presented below:

- Most of the students opined the reasons for the choice of the course and college as the motivation by their parents and the former students.
- Regarding the infrastructure facilities of the college, majority of the students were happy with the equipment in the labs, and library, and few were unsatisfied with the facilities in the hostel.
- Regarding the faculty, they preferred the faculty who were knowledgeable, friendly, well prepared and broad minded, with whom they didn't hesitate to share their problems.
- It is heartening that most of the students said that they would give good witness about the college after stepping out of it. They also felt that, they were at an advantage when compared to their counterparts studying in other colleges and institutions of education.
- Students disclosed the feeling that the course has enabled them to develop good teaching skills and are happy with the terminal outcome of the course.
